

## Examples of label for containers of combustible dust

### 1. For organic<sup>^</sup> (in packages of 25kg or more), non-hazardous<sup>#</sup> chemical or plastic combustible dusts

Labels to warn of combustible dust hazard to include:


“Warning: May form explosible dust-air mixture if dispersed”

<sup>^</sup> Examples of organic dust include potato starch, flour, cocoa powder etc.

<sup>#</sup> Non-hazardous refers to substances not classified as hazardous under GHS e.g. lactose, polyethylene

### 2. For metal, other chemical or plastic combustible dusts

A warning statement “Warning: May form explosible dust-air mixture if dispersed” is required on the GHS\* label of the container.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Use only outdoors or in a well-ventilated area.</li><li>▪ Avoid breathing dust/fumes.</li><li>▪ Wear protective gloves, protective clothing, eye protection and face protection.</li><li>▪ Wash all exposed external body areas thoroughly after handling.</li><li>▪ Store in a well-ventilated place. Keep container tightly closed.</li></ul>
